


#### The use of Tú and Usted

- Tú and Usted mean the same thing:
  YOU
- This YOU is singular, not as a group.
  - Ex:YOU Mary not YOU GUYS
- **Tú** is the informal version, meaning the way you talk to your brother, friend or someone your age. It is very familiar!
- Usted is used when we talk to an adult, an elderly person or someone with a higher rank. It is formal!

### **United States**



- There are 350 million people that speak Spanish in the world.
- Spanish is from the region of Spain call CASTILLA. The real name of the Spanish language is "Castellano".
- It is called the "language of Cervantes", the author of the famous Don Quijote de la Mancha.
- The "conquistadores" and "exploradores" brought the language to the AMERICAS in the 15<sup>th</sup> century and 16<sup>th</sup> century.
- Spanish is the official language of almost all the countries in Central and South America.
- In the U.S., it is the heritage language of more than 40 million people...and counting.
