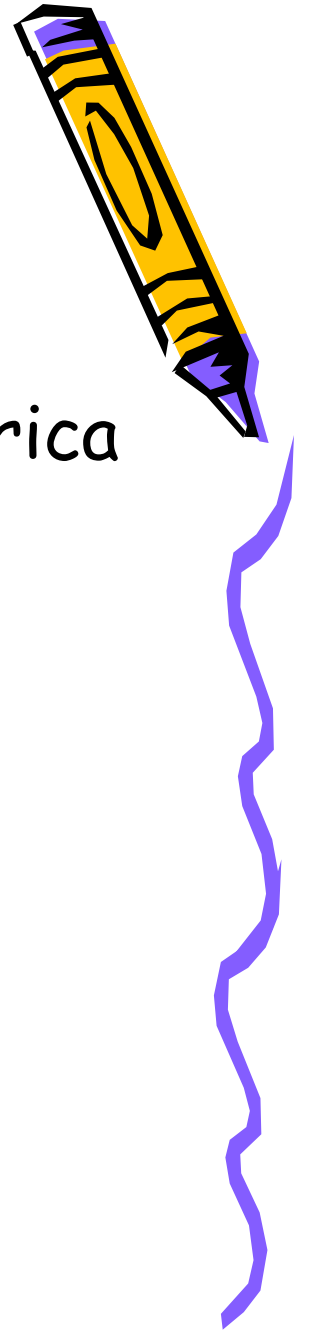
Telling the days of the week

- Lunes: Monday

- Miércoles: Wednesday
- Jueves: Thursday
- Viernes: Friday
- Sábado: Saturday
- Domingo: Sunday



Trivia

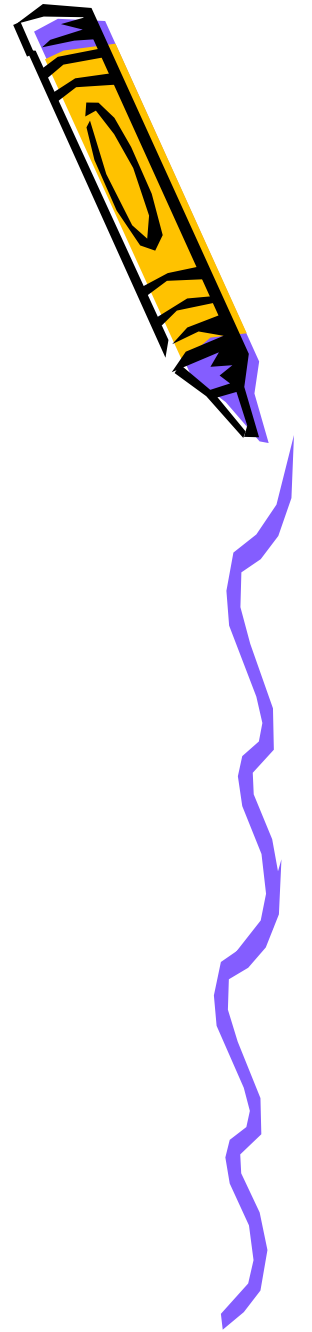
- The first day of the week in Latin America it is not SUNDAY, but MONDAY
- All the names of the week are in lower case: lunes, martes, miércoles...
- The date is written like this:
 - Hoy es (día), el (number) de (mes) de (año)
 - Hoy es **lunes**, el **24** de **septiembre** de **2012**



Los meses: no capital letters either!!!

- febrero
- marzo
- abril
- mayo
- junio

- julio
- agosto
- septiembre
- octubre

How to put the date?

Notice that the first letter of the month is **not a CAPITAL LETTER**

How to put the date?

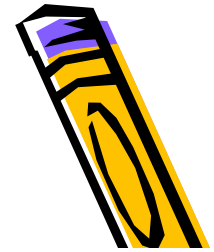
The only day that you are required to put the little "o" on top is the **FIRST** of the month, because we refer to it as el **PRIMERO**

Es el 19 de enero de 2010

* It is always ES EL....

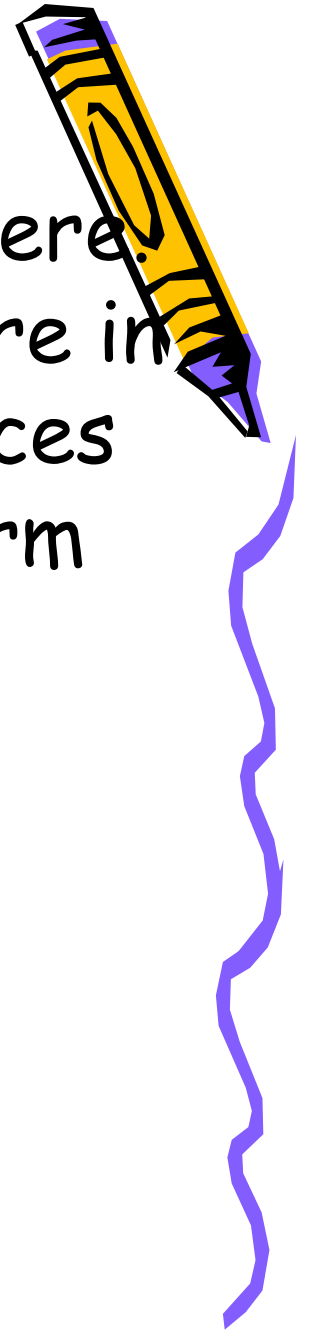
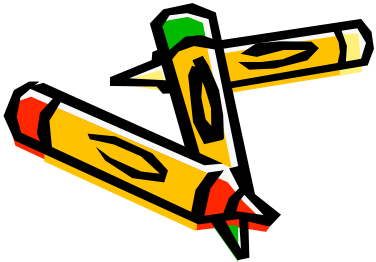


Las Estaciones

- The majority of the seasons in South America are REVERSED than what we have here. Ex: When we are in Summer, they are in Winter.
- Because of the seasons, children go to school in a different period of time. Schools usually start at the end of February or beginning of March and end in the middle of December.
- Christmas happens to be in the beginning of the Summer, so we have a VERY HOT SEASON!!



- Because Latin America is big, our seasons are very different everywhere. In the tropic, Spring time is like here in GA: very humid and rainy, but in places such as Chile, the Spring time is warm and dry, with a very dry Summer.



Practice numbers with cards!!
