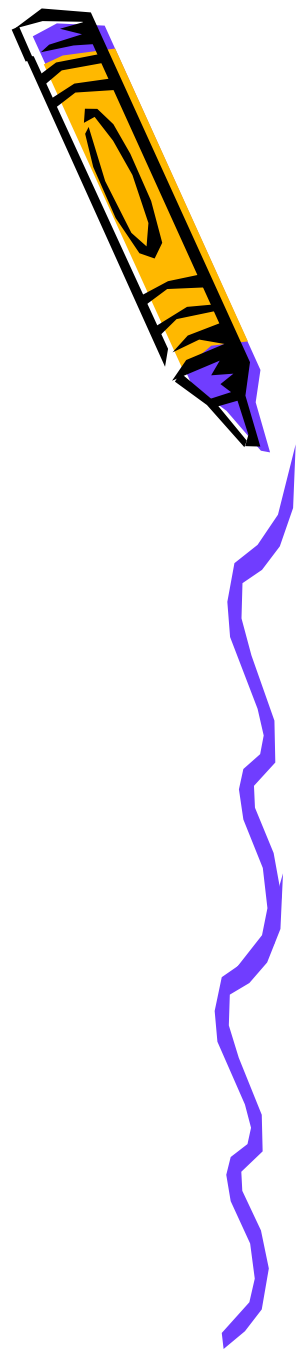

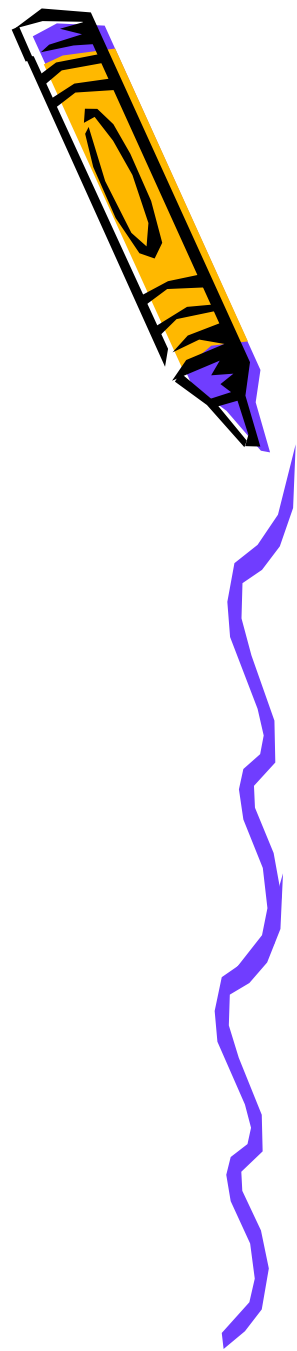

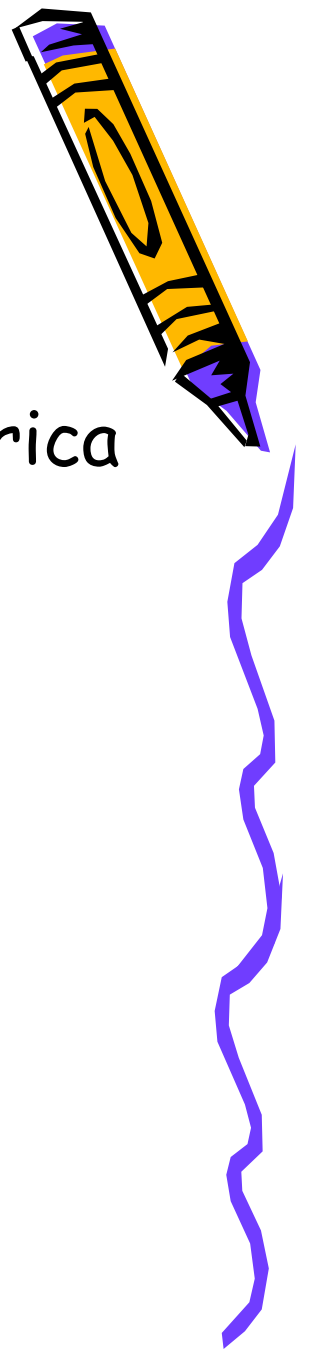
# Telling the days of the week



- Lunes: Monday
- Martes: Tuesday
- Miércoles: Wednesday
- Jueves: Thursday
- Viernes: Friday
- Sábado: Saturday
- Domingo: Sunday



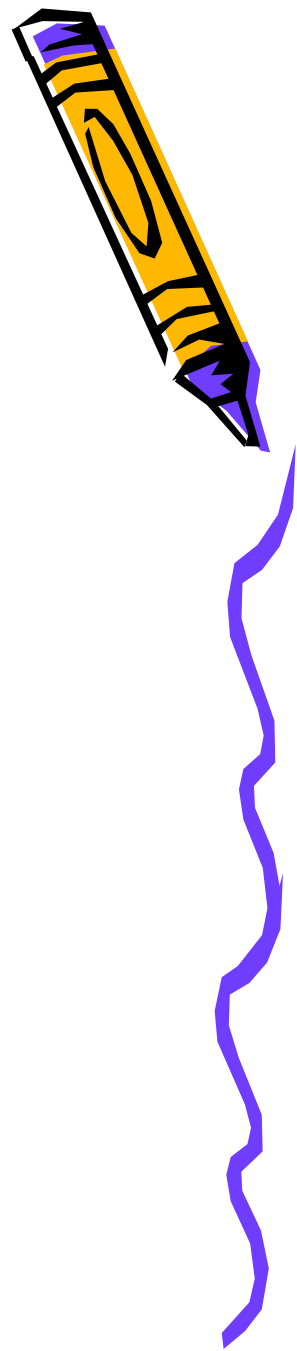
# Trivia



- The first day of the week in Latin America it is not SUNDAY, but MONDAY
- All the names of the week are in lower case: lunes, martes, miércoles...
- The date is written like this:
  - Hoy es (día), el (number) de (mes) de (año)
  - Hoy es **lunes**, el **24** de **septiembre** de **2012**



# Los meses: no capital letters either!!!



- enero
- febrero
- marzo
- abril
- mayo
- junio
- julio
- agosto
- septiembre
- octubre
- noviembre
- diciembre



# How to put the date?

Notice that the first letter of the month is not a **CAPITAL LETTER**

23 de enero de 2010



DAY de MONTH de YEAR

# How to put the date?

The only day that you are required to put the little "o" on top is the **FIRST** of the month, because we refer to it as **el PRIMERO**

Es el **1<sup>o</sup>** de enero de 2010

\* It is always ES EL....

The question is: ¿Qué día es hoy? Or ¿Qué fecha es hoy?
