3.4 Present tense of **tener** and **venir**

ANTE TODO The verbs **tener** (*to have*) and **venir** (*to come*) are among the most frequently used in Spanish. Because most of their forms are irregular, you will have to learn each one individually.

3.4 Present tense of **tener** and **venir**



The verbs **tener** and **venir**

		tener	venir
SINGULAR FORMS	yo	tengo	vengo
	tú	tiene s	vienes
	Ud./él/ella	tiene	viene
PLURAL FORMS	nosotros/as	ten emos	ven imos
	vosotros/as	ten éis	ven ís
	Uds./ellos/ellas	tiene n	viene n

3.4 Present tense of **tener** and **venir**

- ▶ The endings are the same as those of regular **-er** and **-ir** verbs, except for the **yo** forms, which are irregular: **tengo**, **vengo**.

3.4 Present tense of **tener** and **venir**

- In the **tú**, **Ud.**, and **Uds.** forms, the **e** of the stem changes to **ie** as shown below.

INFINITIVE	VERB STEM	VERB FORM
tener	→ ten-	tú ti enes Ud./él/ella ti ene Uds./ellos/ellas ti enen
venir	→ ven-	tú vi enes Ud./él/ella vi ene Uds./ellos/ellas vi enen



3.4 Present tense of **tener** and **venir**

- ▶ The **nosotros** and **vosotros** forms are the only ones which are regular. Compare them to the forms of **comer** and **escribir** that you learned on page 96.

tener**comer****venir****escribir**

nosotros/as

ten**emos**com**emos**ven**imos**escrib**imos**

vosotros/as

ten**éis**com**éis**ven**ís**escrib**ís**

Expressions with tener

tener... años	<i>to be... years old</i>
tener (mucho) calor	<i>to be (very) hot</i>
tener (mucho) cuidado	<i>to be (very) careful</i>
tener (mucho) frío	<i>to be (very) cold</i>
tener (mucha) hambre	<i>to be (very) hungry</i>
tener (mucho) miedo (de)	<i>to be (very) afraid/ scared (of)</i>

tener (mucha) prisa	<i>to be in a (big) hurry</i>
tener razón	<i>to be right</i>
no tener razón	<i>to be wrong</i>
tener (mucha) sed	<i>to be (very) thirsty</i>
tener (mucho) sueño	<i>to be (very) sleepy</i>
tener (mucha) suerte	<i>to be (very) lucky</i>
