

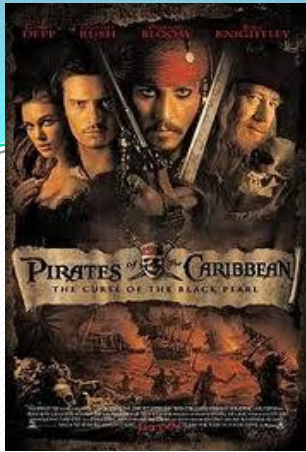

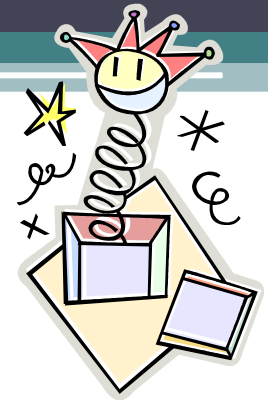
What does it mean?

- Jugar means TO PLAY (GAMES). If you want to use the verb TO PLAY INSTRUMENTS you must use the verb TOCAR.
- The verb “jugar” is part of what we called STEM-CHANGING VERBS. This means that not only the ending of the verb changes but also the root...
- Ex:
- **JUEGO** JUGAMOS
- **JUEGAS** JUGAIS
- **JUEGA** **JUEGAN**

Pop-up!



- The class is divided in two teams.
- Both team get a set of flashcards with the vocabulary of the unit. The cards gets distributed evenly among the students.
- When the teachers starts describing one of the vocabulary words, the student that has the “palabra” must stand up quickly and grab “Lorenzo” (that is in front of the class) before the student on the other team that has the same card. The student must have the right card and have Lorenzo in his/her hand to win the point.
- The group that has more points, WINS 1 FICHA!

- In this vocabulary, we all seat in the floor. Each person is part of group A or B (named by the teacher). Each student will have 4 vocabulary words. “Lorenzo” will pass from student to student. When you get Lorenzo, pick one of your cards and explain what your vocabulary word is, without saying the “direct translation” of the word. Only when someone in your group guesses correctly, you pass “Lorenzo” quickly to the person next to you
- The object of the game is **TO NOT HAVE LORENZO** when the **CLOCK RINGS**. Whoever has Lorenzo at the end, the whole team loses...
